Year 6 Curriculum Information Oak Class Autumn 1 2024

ENGLISH

This half term, Oak Class will study the novel 'Friend or Foe' by Michael Morpurgo. We will use this text alongside extracts from other texts to gather content and ideas enabling us to create our own pieces of writing.



We will study various other genres of texts **FRIEND FOR** through our daily whole class reading lessons and will also have daily grammar lessons.

CURRICULUM

<u>Art</u> – We will be focussing on different aspects of drawing and relating it to our war topic in history. We will focus on the artist Henry Moore and will recreate his drawings of WW2 air raid shelters.

<u>Computing</u> – The topic this term is, 'My Online Life' and will encourage children to think about how secure online information is.

<u>**History**</u> – World War 1 and World War 2 is the topic for history this half-term. We will be looking at how warfare changed between the two world wars and how weapons and technology advanced.

<u>Music</u> – We will be listening to and appraising different types of rock music before learning and performing the song 'Keep the Homes Fires Burning'.

<u>PE</u> – Oak class will take part in PE lessons on a **Monday**. We will be learning the skills and strategies for invasion games through football and netball.

Your child may come to school on their PE day in their PE kit and remain in it all day. Please ensure that children have the correct kit and are still wearing their school jumper or cardigan.

PSHE – PSHE this term will focus on Health and Wellbeing. We are really lucky to be having an outside agency coming in to work with us on Monday afternoons.

<u>R.E</u> - Children will be looking at Christianity and addressing the question: Why is it sometimes difficult to do the right thing? **<u>Science</u>** – Our Science topic this term is The Life Cycle of Plants and Animals. We will be learning how all living things have a life cycle and the importance of the role that reproduction has in

MATHS

This half term, children will be developing their numerical knowledge by focusing on place value, answering problem solving questions and furthering their understanding of calculations.

Alongside this, children will be working daily on their arithmetic skills and on improving the speed of their multiplication tables knowledge.



HOME LEARNING

It is really important that children read regularly at home. Although children must read their school reading book, they

are also encouraged to read for pleasure by choosing books that are of interest to them. This can include non-fiction books, magazines, comics and newspapers as well as fictional stories.



Please try to listen to your child read at least

once a week and sign their reading record to show that you have done so. Reading books and records need to be returned to school **every day**.

A homework menu will be sent home each term. A link will be included on the Oak Class webpage and on Class Dojo. Children should complete one homework of choice from the list each week and if possible, should **post a document or photograph** of the completed learning on Class Dojo.
