Welcome

Welcome back.
We have a very busy and exciting term ahead!

Our topic for the next half term will be Come Outside.

We will be reading *The Gruffalo*, *We're Going On A Bear Hunt* and *Oliver's Vegetable* and looking at the characters and how to retell the stories in our own words.

In maths we will be concentrating on numbers 1- 5 and beyond, exploring more/fewer, understanding the concept of addition and subtraction and looking at measurement.

In phonics we will be continuing with Phase 1 with the children. We are concentrating on rhyme and alliteration eg I spy an object that begins with s. snake (hearing that first phoneme.)

Reading is extremely important and lots of stories read to your child is vital.
Please read daily to your child and encourage them to join in and talk about the pictures.

Don't forget to look on dojo as this will be our main way to communicate with you.
We will show you some of the exciting things we have been up to and how you can further help your child at home.

Forest School every Monday afternoon. Please come to school in joggers, school jumper, named wellies in a bag and a warm coat.

Don't Forget...

Each child should have a named water bottle containing water (no juice please)

A labelled coat every day. Your child will be going outside daily.
