Year 6 Curriculum Information Oak Class Summer 2 2025

ENGLISH

In English lessons this half-term, we will continue looking at different genres of writing and focusing on the grammatical features that are included in each type. Children will then write their own versions using the features they have learnt.

We will also be reading and practising the lines to our end of year leavers' performance, 'Pirates of the Curry Bean'.



CURRICULUM

<u>Geography</u> – Our Key Learning Question this term is: Is there enough for everyone?

We will be looking at the distribution of natural resources, and how trade links are used.

<u>PE</u> – PE this term will be athletics and will take place on Monday afternoons.

<u>R.E</u> – We will continue to look at the overarching question of the year: In what ways is life like a journey? This term, the children will be looking at Islam and specifically, *Why is the Qur'an so important to Muslims?*

<u>Science</u> – In Science this half-term, the children will be looking at electricity. They will be focusing on making different circuits with varying components and recording their observations. The Key Learning Question is: Can a circuit contain more than one component?

<u>Computing</u> – Children will be delving into the world of coding which they will use to create their own game before moving on to creating a program using different features for a set purpose.

We will be spending the final term revising and recapping learning tailored to the needs of the children. It may be topics that in-class assessments show children need more work on, or areas where children would like more practice so that they are fully confident. We will be ensuring that children are confident in the calculation methods that they will be expected to use in high school.

We will also be doing some project work around spirals in nature and maths.

HOME LEARNING

It is really important that children read regularly at home. Although children must read their school reading book, they are also encouraged to read for pleasure by choosing books that are of interest to them. This can include non-fiction books, magazines, comics and newspapers as well as fictional stories.
